AFFIDAVIT

RABBI ELIEZER SILVER and JOSEPH TIGER, each being duly sworn,
according to law, depose and say:

That they are the Chief Rabbi of the Union of the Orthodox
Jewish Congregations of Cincinnati, Ohio, and the President of the
Kehillath B'nai Israel Congregation, of 3225 Harvey Avenue, Cin-
cinnati, Ohio, respectively.

Deponents further state that they have deposited on May 13,
1940 with the Central Trust Company of Cincinnati, Ohio, on behalf
of the Rabbinical Max Adler Committee, the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two
Thousand Dollars) to the credit of Rabbi Max Adler, and that this
amount was deposited from their own personal resources for the ex-
press purpose of guaranteeing the salary of Rabbi Max Adler.

Deponents also state that the aforementioned amount will re-
main in trust with the Central Trust Company and that neither the
total sum of \$2,000.00 nor any part thereof may be withdrawn by
any person except Rabbi Adler upon his arrival in Cincinnati, and
upon proper identification.

Deponents pray that Rabbi Adler's request for an immigration
visa will now receive favorable consideration, especially in view
of the urgent need of his services by the Kehillath B'nai Israel
Congregation.
